

Parcevall Hall Gardens Waterfall Project

The reconstruction of the Parcevall Hall Gardens Waterfall is the last major project of a restoration programme begun over twenty-five years ago.

Sir William Milner played a leading role in the horticultural world in the North of England, becoming the chairman of the Yorkshire Branch of the newly-formed Northern Horticultural Society of 1946 and the second Director of Harlow Carr Gardens for the years 1955-60. Completion of this restoration project would be a fitting tribute to the garden's remarkable creator to mark the 50th anniversary of his death this year.

The YGT considers that the recreation of this waterfall is extremely important for the overall enjoyment of the gardens at Parcevall Hall and we have been active in attending meetings, offering advice, donating monies and spearheading the fund-raising. But we still need to raise a further £3000 to achieve the total cost of £13,825. This needs to be in place by June in order to draw down the promised grant. If you could help us achieve this target we could add the final piece to Sir William's most beautiful and nationally important Arts & Crafts garden.
