25/01725/FU Installation of a 6m Freestanding CCTV Column Temple Newsam Home Farm Temple Newsam Road Halton

Thank you for consulting The Gardens Trust in its role as Statutory Consultee with regard to any proposed development affecting a site listed by Historic England (HE) on their Register of Parks and Gardens. In this case Temple Newsam registered grade II. The Yorkshire Gardens Trust (YGT) is a member organisation of the GT and works in partnership with it in respect of the protection and conservation of historic parks and gardens and is authorised by the GT to respond on GT's behalf in respect of such consultations.

This application follows on from **23/01942/LI Listed building application for alterations to the rear barn elevation of previous approval 21/03302/LI, Temple Newsam Home Farm Temple Newsam Road Halton** to which we responded 5th May 2023 and to which we had no objection.

We note from the Heritage Statement at 5.1 'Proposed Works To install a free standing column to accommodate camera of a pan, tilt and zoom (PTZ) design. It will be colour camera with listening and speech capability, installed with anti-climb on the column. The camera will view down the back of the cow shed covering the solar equipment to the rear of the cow shed; the top of the cow shed viewing the solar panels; egress from pig enclosure over banking; the back doors of great Barn and finally access doors to the education centre building. The installation of a column precludes the need to install a minimum of three PTZ wall mounted cameras to provide similar cover to all of these areas of the building. It is proposed to be in an ideal location for the coverage required. Refer to supporting drawings and photos.'

We consider that the proposed works are unlikely to be visible outside the Home Farm perimeter and should not have any impact on the significance of the wider registered park and garden.

The Gardens Trust and Yorkshire Gardens Trust have no objection.
